ILR Testimonial: Martin Paul jr. Tabe- Ojong PhD candidate

Martin Paul jr. Tabe- Ojong is a PhD student currently working at the Chair of Economic and Agricultural Policy. He holds a Master of science (MSc) in Agricultural and Food Economics (AFECO) and won the Hans H Ruthenberg Graduate award 2019 for his Master thesis. I (Iyanuoluwa Odubote) spoke to him to discuss how to apply for and find Master thesis awards.

I.O: You won the Hans H Ruthenberg Graduate award in 2019. How did you hear about the award?



M.O: I was having an informal talk with a friend who is doing his Ph.D. at

the Center for Development Research (ZEF) on his Ph.D. funding. While telling me his different sponsors, he told me he is also funded by the Foundation fiat Panis. As I went home and googled what the organization is about and what it does I saw it had a lot more to offer other than supporting Ph.D. research. As I kept checking, I saw the Hans H Ruthenberg Graduate award, alongside other awards.

I.O: What was your motivation to apply for it?

M.O: Immediately I went through the requirements of the award, I just had an inner voice telling me to put forth a strong application. I quickly checked the requirements and noticed I met all of them. My lone fear was the deadline which was just in a week. I immediately requested from my thesis supervisor Prof. Dr. Thomas Heckelei a recommendation and a report of the submitted thesis. To be honest, my main motivation for this award was the recognition and honor attached

to it, especially as it deals with food security and hunger. But then, every award comes with a financial gain, so it was worth vying in for.

I.O: What is your recommendation for students who are interested in applying for a graduate award?

M.O: Information is power - there are a lot of support systems and mechanisms in and beyond Germany to push students to hard work and excellence. Keep your ears on the floor and always be on alert for such information. Interact, communicate and talk to your mates. There is always a vital gain when you talk to colleagues and people who share your aspirations. In addition, you must be prepared for it. By preparation, I mean the quality of your thesis has to be great, and the quality of your thesis is in a way dependent on the courses you take as a student and how you engage with the courses. So, my genuine advice is to follow your courses seriously and be clear on what you want to achieve in your thesis.

Master Thesis awards

Theodor Brinkmann-Nachwuchspreis: excellent master theses from study programs in the agricultural faculty of the University of Bonn can be awarded 500 €. Awarding is scheduled twice a year. Check the <u>Theodor Brinkmann website</u> for the next call and more information on your application.

Hans H. Ruthenberg - Graduate Award: outstanding diploma or master theses in the field of food security can be awarded at least 2,500 € per prize-winner. Visit the <u>Foundation fiat panis</u> website for more information.

OECOTROPHICA-Preis: master theses and dissertations in the areas of nutrition and consumer research can be awarded 750 €. Find out more about the application process at the BerufsVerband Oecotrophologie e.V. (VDOE) website.

Science Award of the Gregor Luisoder Environment Foundation: theses or dissertations in the area of environmental protection and nature conservation. Papers can be submitted on an ongoing basis and are awarded $2,500 \in$. Find out more about the foundation and the prize on the <u>GLUS website</u>.

Organic Food Research Prize: master theses and dissertation that deal with the organic food industry or a related topic in the field of sustainability. The best master thesis will receive 3,000 €, the best dissertation 5,000 €. Check the <u>Forschungspreis Bio-Lebensmittel website</u> for the next call and more information on your application.

Stockmeyer Award for Young Scientists: theses with the aim of supporting food research in the interest of safe food. The prize is endowed with 2,500 €. Find out more at the <u>Heinrich</u> Stockmeyer Foundation website.

Amazone Innovation Award: dissertations and theses dealing with innovative topics from the areas of process or machine technology, production of agricultural machinery or sales or service. The best thesis will be awarded 2,000 Euro, the best dissertation 4,000 €. Please find all the information on the <u>Amazone foundation website</u>.
