Dear AFECO students,

Starting 1st of August 2021, I will take over the coordination of the AFECO program. I thank the AFECO Newsletter editors for giving me the chance to introduce myself at this stage.

My name is Nicolas Gerber and I have been working at the University of Bonn for the past 14 years at the Center for Development Research (ZEF) as a senior researcher. Over the last 19 years, I have worked broadly on the management of biodiversity, land and water resources and their interlinkages with poverty, food security, nutrition, and health. At ZEF, I have led research projects investigating rural nutrition at the intersection of agricultural innovation and water and sanitation behavior in Africa and South Asia. More recently, I focused on the issue of urban nutrition in Africa in connection with the organization of the local food system, food safety and quality along the supply chains, and consumers' behavior.

Before joining ZEF, I have studied economics. I started with a Bachelor of Economics in my hometown University of Lausanne, in Switzerland, followed by an MSc in Environmental and Resource Economics at UCL in London, and finally writing my PhD on "Biodiversity measurement and conservation" at UNSW in Australia.

I hope to bring my international experience to the AFECO coordination and to get stimulated by my interactions with all of you – as a coordinator and as a lecturer. AFECO is a great program, offering you a chance to become experts in a wide variety of fields linked to agricultural, food or resource business and economics. Such expertise is in great demand, in particular as our society

aspires to a more sustainable future. You, as AFECO students and then graduates, will have the chance to help steering that change. These are exciting times!

I look forward to meeting all of you in the near future and wish you all a successful exam period.
